

## **Camping Facilities**

### **Provincial Parks:**

#### **Alice Lake Campground**

**Located off Highway 99, approximately 13 km north of Squamish**

Alice Lake is surrounded by towering mountains, dense forests, and grassy areas. There are four fresh water lakes in the park that make swimming and fishing very enjoyable pastimes. There is also access to many mountain bike trails close by the park. Dogs must be on leash and are not permitted on the Alice Lake Trail, beach or playground. The camp ground does have a shower building and flush toilets. It is recommended that camping reservations are made well in advance if you are planning to stay during the summer months.

#### **Stawamus Chief Campground**

**Located off Hwy 99, directly in front of the Stawamus Chief**

Established in 1997, the 517-hectare park provides rock climbing opportunities of international significance. Hiking trails to The Chief's three summits offer rewarding views of Howe Sound, Squamish town site and surrounding mountains. This park has opportunities for camping, hiking, rock climbing and scenic viewing atop the Chief. There are 18 vehicle accessible and 57 walk-in sites. The season runs May 3 - October 15. During the off season you may walk in from the gate. There are no fees and no services during the off season.

#### **Porteau Cove Campground**

**Located 38 km north of Vancouver on Hwy 99, 20 km south of Squamish, 8.5 km south of Britannia Beach.**

The park features waterfront campsites with a view over Howe Sound to the mountains beyond. An old ship has been sunk to provide interest for Scuba divers and to attract marine life. Adjacent train tracks are active and occasional noise disturbance may occur. The campground is operational March 1 – November 11, with a winter fee and reduced services from November 12 – February 28.

### **Recreation Sites:**

#### **Cat Lake Recreation Site**

**Located off Highway 99, just north of the Alice Lake Provincial Park turn off. Rocky forest service road to the lake. Caution Advised.**

This site has 42 walk-in tenting-only campsites located in a heavily forested area around the tiny Cat Lake. The campsites are within a 5 minute walk from the parking lot. Fishing is possible here, Cat Lake is stocked with rainbow trout; no powerboats are allowed on the lake. This site provides access to a network of hiking / biking trails. Firewood may be bought; the site operator is on site overnight. The site works on a first come first serve basis, and is typically busy \*\*Bear problems are frequent.

#### **Squamish Riverside Campsite**

This site has tent pads, tables, fire rings and 2 outhouses. Beautiful site, with room for 10 tents, beside the Squamish River, close to the Ashlu Creek. Very popular for fishing. Pack out all garbage and refuse-there is no garbage pick-up service, and therefore no camping fees at this time. Wheelchair accessible toilet on site.

*Driving Directions:* From the town of Squamish, drive North on HWY 99. Turn left onto Squamish Valley road. The pavement will end at an open gate (the start of the Squamish Nation Tree Farm License), continue on the dirt road for less than 1km, and turn left, over the first bridge you see spanning the Squamish River. The site is located immediately after the bridge on the right side.
